- D. Make up of club in terms of number of freshman, sophomores, etc.

2. Meetings

- A. How often are your meetings? Eg. Weekly, twice a month?
- B. Programs, speakers or other activities to attract members to attend.
- C. Participation of members (other than officers) in the meetings.
- D. Other activities at the meetings.

3. Club Fund Raisers

- A. List each fundraiser and its purpose.
- B. Number of Interactors/students participating.
- C. Number of Rotarians participating.
- D. Amount raised.
- E. How funds were distributed.

4. Club Officers and Board of Directors

BEST INTERACTOR AWARD

Only seniors are eligible to receive this award and it is in the form of a scholarship of approximately \$100-\$200. An Interact Club can only nominate ONE senior from their club. The student should exemplify the goals and purpose of Interact. The award is also based upon scholarship and community service.

The student must submit the following to be eligible:

1. High School Transcripts with current classes and grades
2. A personal essay on the student's experience as an Interactor and how it will affect their future. Describe one example where the student's involvement in Interact, positively changed an individual or situation. The essay should be no more than 1000 words in length.
3. Two letters of recommendation (Not relatives).
One from a Faculty member AND one from a person in the community.
4. Include a cover sheet with name, address, and telephone number.

BEST INTERACT CLUB IN DISTRICT 5190

A separate application is not needed for this award.

This award is given to the Interact Club that best exemplifies the Interact ideals of service to the campus, local and international communities.

Only clubs that submit applications in EACH of the areas of service (Club, Campus, Community, & International) will be eligible to win the award.

BEST INDIVIDUAL CLUB PROJECT

Chosen at the discretion of the Rotary awards committee. No additional application or information is necessary.

Good luck to all. Please submit applications on time. The committee will reserve the right to accept or reject applications received after the due date.

Make and keep a copy for your records.

These awards are given out at our annual district conference, so mark this date down; May 21-23, 2010.
